- **1.** Call to Order: 6:30 p.m., virtual meeting at Zoom.us & physical meeting at Village Hall Meeting Room, 122 E. Lincoln Ave., Fall Creek
- 2. Pledge to Flag
- 3. Roll Call: Members Present: Village President Tim Raap, Trustees Ben Burch, Kelli Corbin, Bob Jenkins, Sheena Kaatz, Matt Mattoon, Karen Strasburg. Members Absent: None.  - b. Consider Ordinance Amendment to §52-8 Ordinance and Resolutions, Possible 1st Reading:
 - MOTION (Burch/Raap) to hold the first reading of an amendment to §52-8.A. Meetings/Ordinances and Resolutions. Amendment basically 1) allows for an ordinance amendment to be brought directly to the Board rather than requiring it be considered at committee level first, and 2) includes the Administrator/Public Works Director as one of the people who can submit an ordinance amendment for the Board's consideration.
